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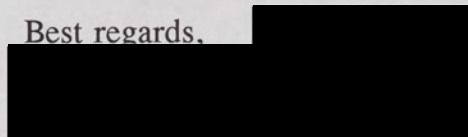

ALERT MEMO



These German postage stamps are examples of the economic disaster we are now facing. Germany was going through hyper-inflation—with the cost to mail a letter increasing to 500,000,000 marks (the German dollar). This is what happened when the politicians completely lost control of the German federal budget—and ended up printing money so fast that German money became absolutely worthless.

We must stop this disaster from happening in America. The President's Audit Committee forecast a national debt of \$13,000,000,000,000 by the year 2000. Thomas Jefferson proposed a constitutional amendment requiring a balanced budget some 200 years ago. We, the people, must now force Congress to act on Jefferson's Balanced Budget Amendment. We are running out of time!

BALANCED BUDGET CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

"SECTION 1. Outlays of the United States for any fiscal year shall not exceed receipts to the United States for that year, unless three-fifths of the whole number of both Houses of Congress shall provide for a specific excess of outlays over receipts.

"SECTION 2. Any bill to increase revenues shall become law only if approved by a majority of the whole number of both Houses of Congress by a rollcall vote.

"SECTION 3. The Congress may waive the provisions of this article for any fiscal year in which a declaration of war is in effect.

"SECTION 4. This article shall take effect in fiscal year 1991 or for the second fiscal year beginning after its ratification, whichever is later."
