



I write to you today to share with you -- one who I know is committed to progressive principles -- my view about our country and its direction, and because I want you to join me as a partner in an effort to build a progressive movement that promises to reshape our nation as we move into the 21st century.

Over the past few months you and I have seen our long-time progressive vision vindicated by dramatic changes throughout the world.

We're now witnessing a profound world-wide shift towards citizens' movements for democracy and human rights -- from China to Chile, from South Africa to Eastern Europe.

Not for some time have the moral imperatives of our progressive agenda found such political opportunities as exist now.

The letter you now hold in your hands may strike you as being unusually long....

But I urge you not to lay it down. There is so much to say.

Please take a few minutes to review its central points -- argue with me about them, if you like -- and then think very seriously about your own commitment before you act.

Throughout my 19 years in Congress, I have seen and learned a great deal.

And so much that I've struggled against -- much of what I'm sure we've both experienced over the years -- has caused me great pain.

I'm thinking now about the 58,000 Americans -- and millions of Asians -- killed in Viet Nam, Cambodia, and Laos in the Sixties and early Seventies. I'm thinking of the betrayal of our Constitution by President Nixon exposed during Watergate. I'm thinking of the heartless abandonment of our nation's poor, sick, and unemployed throughout the 1980s.
