MICHAEL KELLY was born in Washington, D.C., in 1957. He majored in history at the University of New Hampshire. After working for the ABC television program *Good Morning America* for three years he became a reporter on the metropolitan desk of *The Cincinnati Post*. He was also the Washington correspondent for *The Baltimore Sun*. In 1989, he became a free-lance writer and moved to Chicago. He wrote for *The Boston Globe*, *Gentlemen's Quarterly*, *Esquire*, and *Playboy*. During the Gulf War he was a special correspondent for *The New Republic*, earning both an Overseas Press Club Award and a National Magazine Award. Following the war, he went to work for *The New York Times* as a Washington correspondent, covering the 1992 presidential campaign. He is married to Madelyn Kelly, a producer for *CBS Evening News*.
