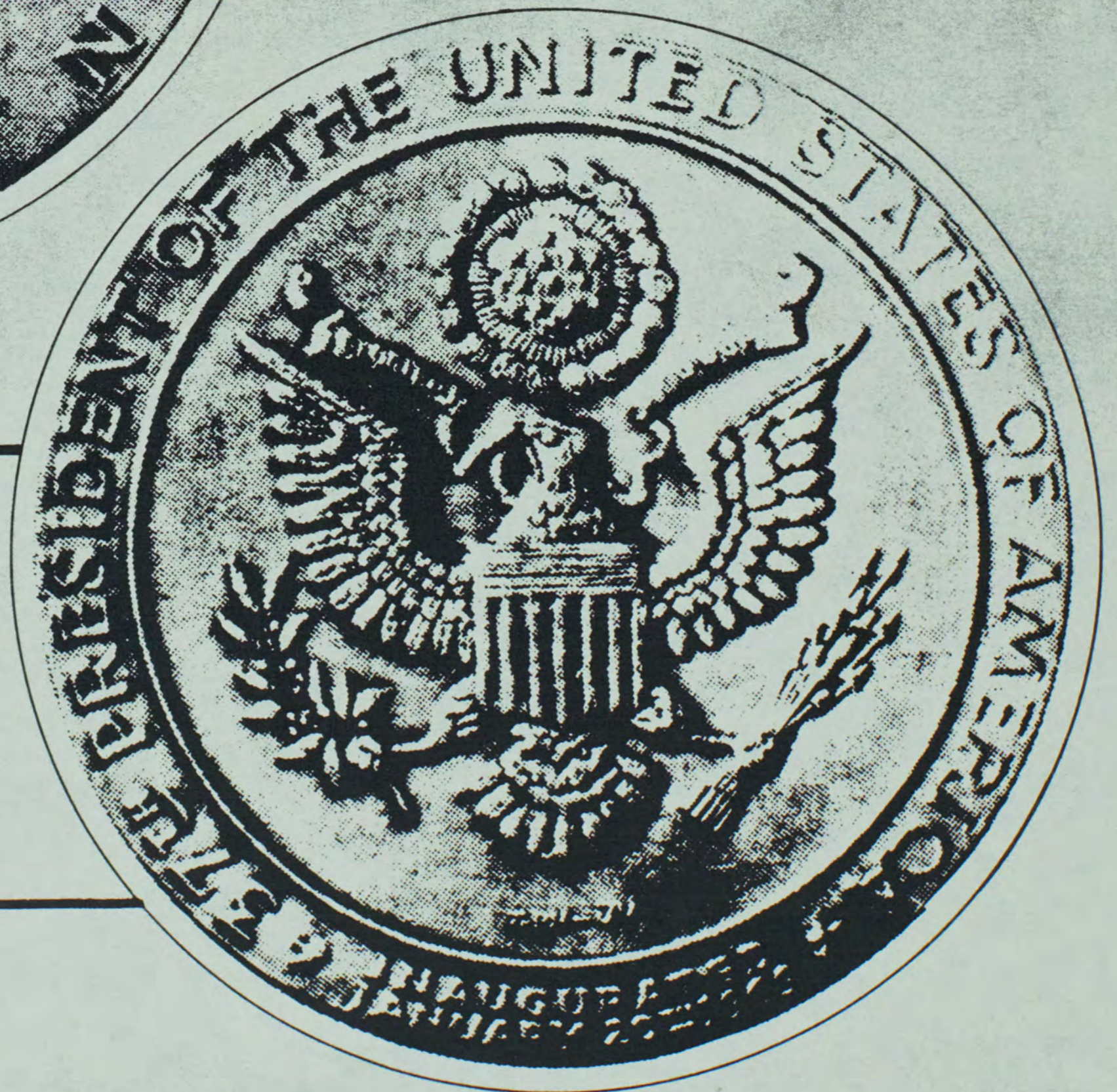

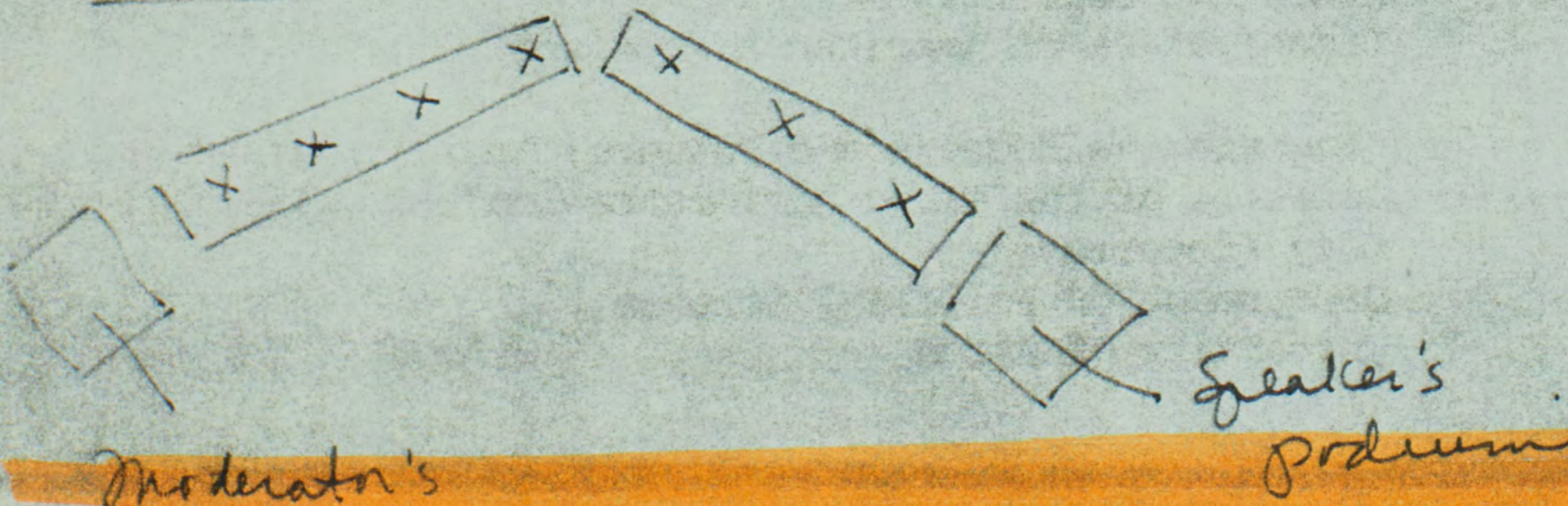

Keynote Address: HENRY A. KISSINGER

Ambassador of the
People's Republic of
China to the U.S.



Henry Alfred Kissinger was sworn in on September 22, 1973, as the 56th Secretary of State, a position he held until January 20, 1977. He also served as Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs from January 20, 1969, until November 3, 1975.

At present Dr. Kissinger is Chairman of Kissinger Associates, Inc., an international consulting firm. Dr. Kissinger is also a member of the President's Foreign Intelligence Advisory Board, a Counselor to the Chase Manhattan Bank and a member of its International Advisory Committee, a member of the Commission on Integrated Long-Term Strategy of the National Security Council and Defense Department, and an Honorary Governor of the Foreign Policy Association.

Among the awards Dr. Kissinger has received have been the Nobel Peace Prize in 1973; the Presidential Medal of Freedom, this nation's highest civilian award, in 1977; and the Medal of Liberty in 1986.

Henry A. Kissinger received the B.A. degree summa cum laude at Harvard College in 1950, and the M.A. and Ph.D. degrees at Harvard University in 1952 and 1954.
