One example being C-Span's Washington Journal where the commentators take all of the major newspapers and he and his guest select news articles to talk about and inbetween the commentators take calls on a liberal line, a conservative line and a moderate line.

It is common knowledge that at least 85% of the newspapers and their reporters are liberal.
