I called back to Washington Journal. The girl who answered the phone told me "you had your say". But - I said, I didn't get to put my article on the air.


Through my experience with C-Span, it confirmed my suspicions - C-Span is also B I A S E D just like the rest of the media. The media only lets people on the air that suits themselves.
