### Russell Means

American Indian Movement (AIM)

*The City Club* of Cleveland, Ohio is sponsoring a forum which will feature Russell Means, one of the leaders of the American Indian Movement who led the American Indian opposition to the 500th anniversary observance of Columbus' discovery of America this past year. He will discuss his current cause to develop an Indian anti-defamation league.

Mr. Means first spoke at the *The City Club* in 1973 defying the United States government over conditions of oppression at the Wounded Knee, South Dakota. He was born on South Dakota's Pine Ridge Reservation into the Oglala Sioux tribe. After World War II he moved with his family to California where he grew up. He later moved to Cleveland where he served as Director of the city's American Indian Center. Mr. Means is also currently starring in the title role of the popular movie, "The Last of the Mohicans."

**RUSSELL MEANS**  
**American Indian Movement**  
**December 11, 1992**

**Russell Means** has been described by *The Los Angeles Times* as the most famous Indian since Sitting Bull and Crazy Horse. One of the early leaders of the American Indian Movement (AIM), this past year he led the American Indian opposition to the 500th anniversary observance of Columbus' discovery of America.

He will be our forum speaker Friday noon, Dec. 11. He first spoke here in 1973 on his defiance of the United States government over conditions of oppression at Wounded Knee, South Dakota. His current cause is the effort to develop an Indian anti-defamation league.

**This forum is another in the annual series on "Civil Liberties" established in memory of the late Judge David Ralph Hertz.**

Earlier, in 1970 on Thanksgiving Day, he led an Indian contingent that seized Mayflower II in Plymouth, Massachusetts. Other events he has staged in order to draw attention to the plight of the American Indian include a prayer vigil on Mount Rushmore and a \$9,000,000 lawsuit filed against the Cleveland Indians in which he alleged that the team's nickname defamed American Indians.

Means was born on South Dakota's Pine Ridge Reservation into the Oglala Sioux tribe. Shortly after the outbreak of World War II his father moved the family to California where he found work in the naval department. He attended both public and reservation schools in Vallejo. Sometime later he ended up in Cleveland where, for a time, he served as director of Cleveland's American Indian Center.

Currently he is playing the title role in the popular movie hit, "The Last of the Mohicans," now showing in local theaters. Based on the classic novel by James Fenimore Cooper, the movie is considered a possible contender for an Academy Award.
