I noted with considerable interest C-SPAN's plans for the late summer re-enactment of the Lincoln-Douglas debates of 1858. As a former history teacher and sculptor I am thinking of ways to be involved.

I have nearly completed a sculpture set of Lincoln and Douglas which I plan to introduce at various shops in Illinois around May. I already have the "Lincoln Family ca 1858" and "Trial Lawyer" in a number of places. Perhaps the set could be included in the C-SPAN "Bust Stop in the Classroom" exhibit. The 7" busts in bonded bronze (includes the oak base) could help put students more in touch with the careers of Lincoln and Douglas and spark interest in governmental affairs. They might become part of the permanent resources of C-SPAN. Other famous Americans and world leaders which become the focus of your exhibits might be sculpted for the future if you like my work.
