Perot: No 'October Surprise' Candidacy Planned, But. ...

WASHINGTON (AP) - Ross Perot said Friday he's not planning any "October surprise" return to the presidential race but left the door open if Republicans and Democrats don't adequately address the federal deficit and other issues.

"If the volunteers said, 'It's a dirty job but you gotta do it,' I belong to them," the Dallas businessman said, referring to his supporters.

Perot, who abruptly ended his independent bid for the White House in July, said during a call-in show on C-SPAN: "Let's try to get the two parties to step up to the plate. If they don't, we'll do what we have to do."

Still, he said concerning the possibility he would try to revive his candidacy, "There's no plan for an October surprise or a September surprise. There's nothing planned."

In the hour-plus go-round, some callers said they were angry he had abandoned his run for the White House after promising to make the quest if volunteers put him on all ballots.

A woman from Virginia Beach, Va., sounded confused.

"When you got out, first I was shocked and then I cried and then I was very angry. And now I'm simply perplexed. I'm wondering, What are you doing?" she said to Perot.

After several more phone calls accusing him of reneging on his pledge to run, Perot said, "We didn't disappear. ... We redoubled our effort to make the two-party system work."

Perot said supporters still involved in a "United We Stand" movement were serving as a "massive tap on the shoulder" to President Bush, Democrat Bill Clinton and House and Senate candidates to fully address the deficit and other issues.

He said he was on the ballot in 49 states but that his group might endorse Bush or Clinton if they adequately addressed important issues.

"We have an option if they ignore us," Perot said, alluding to a potential re-entry. But he said "we will have failed" if he is forced to run himself because that will mean Republicans and Democrats failed to respond.

He urged Bush and Clinton to stick to economic issues.

"If you want to totally destroy your credibility ... just keep up the slimy mudslinging that's been going on. It has nothing to do with solving America's problems," he said.

One caller asked him if he would go to work in a Bush administration, should the president win re-election.

"That is wishful thinking on your part," Perot said, noting that White House spokeswoman Marlin Fitzwater had been critical of him early last summer.

"Fitzwater called me a monster and it goes downhill from there. I'm not overly impressed with talk like that," Perot said. Besides, he said, he was not impressed with what has happened in the country in the past 12 years of Republican leadership.
