The Moscow Evening News is, in my opinion, the best general news program on television. I watch it every evening (and on Saturday morning), and a number of my friends also tune in.

As I said in my letter to ITA, more Russian programming would be fascinating. How about airing a weekly sampling of news, music, commercials, and children's programs from Russia? For that matter, why not show television news (and other programs) from around the world?

Americans are appallingly ignorant of other cultures and of foreign news. You have a unique opportunity to truly bring the world into our living rooms. I, for one, would rather watch news from around the world than listen to those windbags in Congress speak volumes to empty chambers. I bet others would too.
