filled with hate?

Do you believe God is going to forgive you for killing mankind and trying to destroy the earth?

I'm sending you a copy of our "Bill of Rights." What type of rights have you provided in your country and "Kuwait." You must ask yourself what you can do to prevent further destruction and do it. It takes a good man to admit his error, and I believe you can be that person.

The weather has been cooling off as the Saudi winter approaches. Mid 90s during the day, low 70s at night. I understand some places in the desert are cooling off to mid 50s at night. At least it'll be easier to sleep at night now.

I understand President Bush will be here tomorrow, shoot maybe I'll get on TV, Nah, I doubt it. I haven't heard how long he'll be staying. I also understand Bob Hope is trying to put on another Christmas show, that is something I would most definitely want to see.

Well, I hope and pray you are all well and have a great thanksgiving and a better Christmas Holiday.
